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DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Director Shawn Thrasher talked about the Culture Fest and the organizations, local groups and performers who participated. He mentioned the Star Wars event that took place on Saturday, May 11th and how popular it has become. He reminded all the board members of the upcoming Serving with a Purpose event on Thursday, May 23rd at the Ontario Convention Center. He provided an update on the Little Free Libraries and how the initial painting process on the newspaper stands did not work. Little Free Libraries is now partnering with Chaffey High School's art department to submit eight designs for approval by end of the school year. Painting will begin in the fall when the students return. Once completed they will be stationed at various community centers. Shawn ended with the announcement of the name change for Colony. It is now the Lewis Family Branch.

STAFF REPORT

Youth Services Program

Supervising Librarian Daisy Flores from Youth Services provided a presentation on programming. She talked about the programming that Youth Services provides for children, teens and families. She provided statistics to show how the programs and attendance has increased. She had statistics to show how tours of the library and outreach events have increased throughout the years. Daisy talked about how the programs, tours and outreach would not be available without the help of staff. She talked about how repurposing the collection, adding shelf talkers and Playaway products have increase circulation. Daisy ended her presentation with how funds from Friends of the Library and various grants help to extend family place, provide mental health training to staff, and help with our summer lunch program.

Summer at your Library & Summer Lunch

Assistant Library Director Courtney Saldana provided a presentation on the new and improved Summer at Ontario City Library. She briefly summarized what summer reading is currently at the library. On August 2018 a committee was formed of staff from Youth Services, Adult Services, Lewis Branch, and Circulation from both libraries to tear apart summer to see what works and what doesn't. The committee wanted to approach summer so all staff would be genuinely excited and be able to sell their excitement to the community. The approach was to involve all spectrums of the community by focusing on fun. This was done by focusing on fun in programming, events and an eight-hour staff retreat. The retreat was a breakdown of what the committee wanted summer to be. They wanted to encourage reading for all ages, strengthen the library's role as a community hub and open doors to positive experiences. At the Library's spring staff day, the California Library Association provide some presenters to talk about different aspects of Summer at Libraries. The staff led the breakout sessions and had interactive sessions and reporting. The presenters provided some summer outcomes and quality indicator information as well as summer meals across other state libraries. Courtney talked about how summer reading and lunch go hand in hand and what each Library will be doing to start the

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Summer Kick-off. Ovitt and Lewis will both have Summer Kick-off events starting with Chalk It Up, performers, some type of art event and other programs to then encourage attendees to sign up for the Summer Reading program. Courtney ended by asked the Board member to become advocates and help get the word out about the Summer Reading and Lunch programs.
