# **CITY MANAGER'S UPDATE**

The City of Ontario continues to thrive and offer a wide variety of premier programs and services for 2016.

In Ontario Ranch, the southern part of the City formerly referred to as the New Model Colony, we continue to welcome new residents with housing complexes that offer a host of amenities and cutting edge services. In fact, the LA Times recently featured a story on the progress at Ontario Ranch and highlighted Ontario Ranch as a new "gigabit community", with infrastructure paid for by Ontario Ranch developers. This new high-speed fiber infrastructure will give residents the ability to download movies in less than six seconds, and will allow those with home-based businesses and companies in the area the chance to grow their businesses and connect at top speed with the rest of the world. Ontario's low cost structure for gigabit technology is by far the most accessible pricing model offered anywhere in the United States. Your Ontario International Airport also continues to be the focus of our Mayor and City Council. Last December, the City of Ontario, Ontario International Airport Authority, Los Angeles World Airports and the City of Los Angeles settled the existing legal disputes; and Los Angeles agreed to transfer the airport to local control. The transfer is now being reviewed by the Federal Aviation Administration, and we look forward to receiving the keys to the airport in July 2016. While it may take a few years to fully rebuild our region's most important economic engine, we look forward to working together to strengthen Southern California's regional aviation network.

# SERVING THE NEIGHBORHOOD: OUR LADY OF GUADALUPE CHURCH

Our Lady of Guadalupe Church resides on the busy street of Sultana between Mission Boulevard and Holt Avenue. The inviting Catholic Church has served as a focal point for the Hispanic neighborhood for over 60 years. The history of the church dates back to 1923, when Margarito and Soledad Chavez loaned their home on East State Street two or three times a week to the teaching of the Christian Doctrine. In 1925, with assistance from Father Patrick Bradley of Ontario's Saint George Church, a hall was built on East Park Street. This hall was dedicated to Saint Teresa, and served as a chapel for those in the area. The priest from Saint George would come and hold mass every Sunday. In 1935 the chapel was finally made a parish and the first pastor was Father Jose Nuñez. The parishioners began fundraising for the construction of a new church building, and in 1948

Our Lady of Guadalupe moved to its Sultana Street location. The church continues to serve as a house of worship and a social gathering place for its parishioners and those in the surrounding area.

The Ontario Museum of History & Art will be exhibiting the graphite portraits of Our Lady of Guadalupe parishioners, created by artist Andrea Benitez, in the exhibition Faces of the Community. The exhibition runs from April 7 – August 7, 2016 in the museum's Carlson Gallery. For more information contact the museum at (909) 359-2510.
