# DR. ELSWOOD CHAFFEY -**ANOTHER ADVENTUROUS CHAFFEY BROTHER!**

Dr. Elswood Chaffey, one of George's three younger brothers, was born in Brockville, Ontario in 1850. He attended medical school at Queen's University in Kingston, graduating with an MD in 1871. After marrying Miss Eliza Boswell in 1876, Elswood moved his young family to Jamaica where he worked as a government physician. In July 1883, he decided to come to Ontario to practice medicine and ranch citrus, and built a handsome \$4,000 single-story ranch home at Euclid Avenue and 5th Street.

In 1889, he sold his property for \$20,000 and moved his growing family to Santa Monica, where he patented a new type of wave-motor for generating electricity, along with

two mechanisms for transmitting the generated power. In October 1893, Elswood and JB Tays, designer of Ontario's infamous mule car, sailed to British Guiana in search of gold but returned empty handed in July 1894 after Elswood suffered a feverish illness and was in recovery. However, not long after his return he packed up once again, moving his family of eight to rural Mexico where he was a country doctor until his death on Christmas Day, 1920 in Lerdo, Durango, Mexico at age 70. Elswood and Eliza had seven children, three boys and four girls. Their three sons all died young. Three of his daughters returned to Ontario, where two of them enjoyed long nursing careers, and his oldest daughter married and lived in California and Utah.

After August 6, 2010, holding a garage sale on any other days, besides the weekends designated by the City, will result in a possible citation or fine. The City is limiting the dates for yard sales to help prevent traffic and parking problems in our neighborhoods, and to keep the City attractive.

## SMART PHONE APPLICATION

The City of Ontario has unveiled the "myOntario" iPhone and Android Phone application that allows residents with smart phones to point, click and send photos of maintenance issues

iPhone and Android users may download the "myOntario" application for free from the iPhone App Store and Android Market by searching for the keyword "myOntario".

Once installed, users will simply open the application and follow the prompts to take a picture of the issue and then tap "submit". Using built-in global positioning system technology, "myOntario" will attach a location to the picture and route the information about the problem to the appropriate City department for resolution. City staff and Vendors will now be able to respond like a business, using better technology, encouraging efficiency and faster response times.






