REPORT ON CLOSED SESSION

City Attorney Huber advised that there were no reportable actions from the Closed Session discussions.

The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Council Member Valencia.

Dr. Juan Williams Sr., representing Ontario Christian Center was not present for the invocation.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Kristine Scott, Southern California Gas Company, as a Board Member representing the Greater Ontario Business Council, announced their upcoming Vision 2020 event on January 31, 2020, which will include an economic forecast for the Inland Empire and discussion of the importance of the 2020 census, connectivity of the Inland Empire and the needs of neighbors without homes. She stressed the issues of homelessness and their commitment to working with all stakeholders in the community.

Vanessa Powers commended the City on its work in regaining control of the airport but noted that the City is having growing pains including lots of traffic, specifically on G Street. She noted recent traffic fatalities and speeders and asked the City Council to look at ways to address her traffic concerns. She also commented on the local homeless population and noise issues. She expressed appreciation to the City Council for any assistance they could provide. City Manager Ochoa asked that she speak with Executive Director of Housing and Neighborhood Preservation Bjork and Deputy Police Chief Lorenz.

Mayor Leon opened the public hearing asking those persons interested in this item to speak. The following person spoke:

Ben Benoit, representing the California Apartment Association, thanked City staff for reaching out to his organization to discuss the proposed fees. He expressed concern with the proposed increase in the Rental Inspection Program fee from \$36 to \$46 per unit per year. He requested that if this increase was adopted, that it be phased in to allow the apartment owners to plan and budget for it.

Hearing no additional requests to speak, Mayor Leon closed the public hearing.

Mayor Leon commented on the importance of maintaining a safe and quality environment for our residents and the impact of the Rental Inspection Program inspection on that regard.
