STAFF REPORT

Tournament of Books & Our Favorites from 2017

Assistant Director Shawn Thrasher, Senior Librarian Janis Young from Adult Services and Library Assistant Claudia Arroyo from Colony Branch provided some of their favorite books for 2017. Shawn first talked about the mission to instill a lifelong love of reading to the community. As part of that we have a contest at the Library for reading the most pages. The winner is give the coveted gold book award. Shawn then provided two of his favorite fiction books Magpie Murders by Anthony Horowitz and Six Wakes by Mur Lafferty with brief summaries on each. Janis followed with two of her favorite non-fiction books Killers of the Flower Moon by David Grann and Lost City of the Monkey God by Douglas Preston with brief summaries for each of them. Claudia talked about her favorite young adult novels The Hate You Give by Angie Thomas and Moxie by Jennifer Mathieu with a brief summary of each of them.

Montage Software

Senior Librarian Kelly Zackmann shared new ways in which the Model Colony history room is sharing their unique collections with the public. She explains how most repositories only have collections available to users requiring them to physically come into the Library. If users cannot visit the Library, help is done remotely, which can be challenging due to delivery. Since 2017 the Library has been working toward digitizing the Model Colony room materials. The California Audio Visual Preservation project helped get things started and funded. This allowed the Library to get some of the items digitized and put on the internal archives. This project morphed into California Revealed. This is a partnership between California Repositories, of which we are one, the California Preservation Program and the California State Library. Another project we are working on is Clearwater. This is a collaboration with Claremont College Library, the National Archives in Riverside, Cal-State Northridge, Cal-State San Bernardino, Upland Library and A.K. Smiley Public Library. It is a project designed to bring Southern California water related materials together in one database for a one stop shop to find resources. To have more flexibility on what can be shared online and to organize it we decided to obtain our own system. Now we can create online exhibits and collections. Montage DC from Auto Graphics is a system that offers a good amount of space for digital objects at a great price. Kelly provided some examples of what can be seen when logged into the site and how the users can maneuver through the system. Montage has the ability to create special exhibits and the Library's top priority is to get collections created and content uploaded.

She concluded the briefing with the annual budget process and how to request specific budget items through the Council Representative. She also introduced City Manager Scott Ochoa to the attending Board members.
