REVIEW FOR FILE NO. PCUP13-005: A Conditional Use Permit (File No. PCUP13-005) to expand an existing 2,680-square foot place of worship (Church of God of Prophecy), to include a 2,000-square foot pastor residence, and a 5,000-square foot class room building, generally located at the northwest corner of Campus Avenue and Belmont Street, at 1118, 1126 and 1130 South Campus, within the R1 (Single-Family Residential Zone). The project is categorically exempt from the requirements of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to Section 15301 (Class 1, Existing Facilities) of the CEQA Guidelines. The proposed project is located within the Airport Influence Area of Ontario International Airport (ONT) and was evaluated and found to be consistent with the policies and criteria of the Airport Land Use Compatibility Plan (ALUCP) for ONT.
