Abstract

Lena LaVaughn Gordon Moberly was born on the day of the San Francisco earthquake, April 18, 1906 in St. Joseph, Missouri. She received a teaching credential in Iowa and moved to Ontario with her parents in 1926. As teaching positions were very scarce, she enrolled in Mrs. Kate Sanford's School of Cosmetology and received one of the first licenses issued by the California State Board of Cosmetology in 1928. She owned salons in Pomona and Northern California and worked at salons in Ontario and Claremont.

LaVaughn was very involved in community clubs and worked to further the profession of cosmetology by teaching and lecturing. She was past president of the Pomona Valley Coiffeur Guild, the Business and Professional Women's Club, and the Lois Le Baron Avery Toastmistress Club.

In 1948 she submitted the winning slogan for the annual Ontario All States Picnic: "Hi, Neighbor." She won again in 1964 submitting "Ontario – Gateway to the Inland Empire" in the contest sponsored by the Chamber of Commerce. In 1955, she married longtime Pomona barber Melvin "Mobe" Moberly. In 1983, she donated this collection to the Model Colony Room. Several of the artifacts (manicure table, facial chair, hair dressing tools and supplies) were donated to the Chaffey Communities Cultural Center, now the Cooper Museum in Upland. LaVaughn died on March 4, 2000 in Pomona. An oral history of her life is on file in the Model Colony Reading Room
