A meeting of the Oversight Board of the Successor Agency to the Ontario Redevelopment Agency was held on Thursday, February 28, 2013, in the Community Conference Rooms at Ontario City Hall, 303 East "B" Street, Ontario, CA.

Notice of said meeting was duly given in the time and manner prescribed by law.

CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Al Boling called the Oversight Board Meeting to order at 10:01 a.m., and requested the Assistant City Clerk to call the roll.

The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Chairman Boling.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

None.

1. Approval of Minutes

Approved Minutes for the Regular Meeting of September 27, 2012, Special Meeting of October 18, 2012, Regular Meeting of October 25, 2012, Regular Meeting of November 22, 2012, Special Meeting of December 6, 2012, Special Meeting of December 13, 2012, Regular Meeting of December 27, 2012, and Regular Meeting of January 24, 2013.

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MOTION: Moved by Board Member Espinoza, seconded by Board Member Koopman to approve the minutes as presented. The foregoing motion carried by unanimous vote of those present with Members Bertucci and Olhasso absent.

2. A Resolution Approving a Recognized Obligation Payment Schedule for the time period from July 1, 2013 through December 31, 2013

Economic Development Director Andrews explained that this was the Recognized Obligation Payment Schedule for the period beginning July 1, 2013 through December 31, 2013, and clarified that the State was using a different referencing nomenclature, so it was now called "ROPS 13/14A". He also noted for clarification that the backup charts included the status of prior obligation items, such as denials or non-recognition of specific items.

Board Member Koopman requested that IEUA receive copies of the "Notice of Due Diligence Review on the other redevelopment funds in connection with the IEUA Settlement Agreement". He commented that it concerns him that the Department of Finance appears to have more than one opportunity to make adjustments, and questioned the purpose of this body if they have that power. Economic Development Director Andrews concurred that some days it feels like there is a constantly moving target, but stressed that staff continues to provide what they feel is solid backup, in spite of the evolving procedures.

Board Member Undercoffer requested clarification of the notes in the backup charts, such as "reclassified" or "denied". Economic Development Director Andrews clarified that those notes related to the ROPS 3 process, and all projects listed on prior ROPS submittal forms are to continue to be listed on the charts now even if the balances are shown as zero. Board Member Undercoffer questioned the review period for this submittal. Economic Development Director Andrews indicated that upon submittal, the Department of Finance has five days to review the document and request further backup.

MOTION: Moved by Board Member Koopman, seconded by Board Member Espinoza to adopt Resolution No. OOB-016 as presented. The foregoing motion carried by unanimous vote of those presented with Members Bertucci and Olhasso absent.

Background:

Pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 34172, the Ontario Redevelopment Agency ("Agency") was dissolved as of February 1, 2012. The City of Ontario ("Successor Agency") is the successor agency of the Agency. The Oversight Board is responsible for approving the actions of the Successor Agency pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 34179.

<u>Administrative Budget:</u>

Pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 34177(j), the Successor Agency is required to prepare a proposed administrative budget ("Budget") and submit it for approval to the Oversight Board. The Budget is required to include all of the following: (1) estimated amounts for Successor Agency administrative costs for the period between June 1, 2013 through December 31, 2013; (2) proposed sources of payment for all administrative costs; (3) proposals for arrangements for administrative and operations services provided by the City of Ontario.

Pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 34179(h), because the DOF may review Oversight Board actions, the Oversight Board's action to approve the Budget is not effective for five (5) business days, pending a request for review by the DOF.

Fiscal Impact

No funds are involved with the approval of the Administrative Budget.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 34173(d), the City of Ontario ("Successor Agency") is the successor agency to the Ontario Redevelopment Agency ("Agency"), confirmed by Resolution No. 2012-001, adopted on January 10, 2012; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 34179(a), the Oversight Board is the Successor Agency's oversight board; and

WHEREAS, Health and Safety Code section 34177(j) requires the Successor Agency to prepare a proposed administrative budget ("Administrative Budget") and submit the Administrative Budget to the Oversight Board for the Oversight Board's approval; and

WHEREAS, the Successor Agency has submitted the Administrative Budget to the Oversight Board.

THE OVERSIGHT BOARD OF THE SUCCESSOR AGENCY TO THE ONTARIO REDEVELOPMENT AGENCY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Recitals. The Recitals set forth above are true and correct and are incorporated into this Resolution by this reference.

Section 2. CEQA Compliance. The approval of the Administrative Budget through this Resolution does not commit the Oversight Board to any action that may have a significant effect on the environment. As a result, such action does not constitute a project subject to the requirements of the California Environmental Quality Act. The City Clerk of the City of Ontario, acting on behalf of the Oversight Board, is authorized and directed to file a Notice of Exemption with the appropriate official of the County of San Bernardino, California, within five (5) days following the date of adoption of this Resolution.

<u>Section 3.</u> <u>Approval of the Administrative Budget.</u> The Oversight Board hereby approves and adopts the Administrative Budget, in substantially the form attached to this Resolution as Exhibit A, pursuant to Health and Safety Code Section 34177.

<u>Section 4.</u> <u>Severability.</u> If any provision of this Resolution or the application of any such provision to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Resolution that can be given effect

without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this Resolution are severable. The Oversight Board declares that the Oversight Board would have adopted this Resolution irrespective of the invalidity of any particular portion of this Resolution.

<u>Section 5.</u> <u>Certification.</u> The City Clerk of the City of Ontario, acting on behalf of the Oversight Board as its Secretary, shall certify to the adoption of this Resolution.

<u>Section 6.</u> <u>Effective Date.</u> Pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 34179(h), all actions taken by the Oversight Board may be reviewed by the State of California Department of Finance, and, therefore, this Resolution shall not be effective for three (3) business days following the date of its adoption, pending a request for review by the State of California Department of Finance.
