



City of Ontario Truck Routes

Dear Ontario Business Partner in the New Model Colony:

The following is clarification about New Model Colony truck routes based on a high volume of inquiries to the City of Ontario over the last week. Regretfully, the City of Ontario posted additional signage intended to clarify existing designated truck routes without a comprehensive outreach program to impacted businesses and commercial drivers. Please note:

- No changes to existing truck routes are being proposed.
 - New signage was recently posted to identify existing designated truck routes. A map of the existing truck routes (established in 2010) can be found on the back of this flyer.
- Local deliveries and service trips have been and will remain allowable.
 - Trucks over five tons in weight are restricted to designated truck routes unless they are making a local delivery (Ontario Municipal Code Section 4-6.1304). Truck operators are considered to be making local deliveries when their purpose is to make pickups or deliveries of goods, wares, and merchandise from or to any building or structure located on a non-truck route or for the purpose of delivering materials to an active, permitted construction site. Pickups and deliveries related to operating dairies and other agricultural uses are also allowed. Local deliveries must be made via the most direct route to and from the nearest designated truck route.
