The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Cub Scout Troop 309, Ontario.

Due to the absence of the Pastor, Mayor Leon called for a moment of silence in lieu of the Invocation.

CLOSED SESSION REPORT

City Attorney Brown indicated that the matters listed on the agenda were discussed and direction was given to staff, however there was no reportable action.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Peggi Hazlett, representing the Ontario Chamber of Commerce, announced upcoming Chamber events including Small Business Saturday on November 25, 2017, Good Morning Ontario on December 6, 2017 and Vision 2018 on January 26, 2018. She wished the City Council and community a Happy Thanksgiving on behalf of the Chamber and its membership.

Nancy Bumstead welcomed City Manager Ochoa to the Community. She further announced that Burnstead Bicycles was hosting the "Sweet Taste of Giving" toy drive in support of Santa Claus of the Chaffey District, Inc. on November 29, 2017.

Liz McAulis, commented on the tragic death of a middle school student on October 31, 2017, in an accident at Grove and G Street and thanked the first responders for their efforts on behalf of the Torres family. She requested that the City consider lowering speed limits on Grove Avenue, providing more crossing guards, extending the hours of crossing guards and adding more police presence around schools in response to this accident.

AGENDA REVIEW/ANNOUNCEMENTS

City Manager Ochoa indicated that with regard to Item No. 3 of this agenda a revised property list had been provided to the City Council at the dais. He noted that at the time the agenda was posted there were 85 outstanding liens totaling nearly \$25,000; but subsequently, fourteen owners had paid so only 71 remain for a total of \$20,315.34.

4. PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENTS FOR ON-CALL STRUCTURAL PLAN CHECKING AND INSPECTION SERVICES/MC LEAN & SCHULTZ, INC.

City Council approved Professional Services Agreements with McLean & Schultz, Inc. of Brea, California, and Danken, Inc. of Ladera Ranch, California, to provide professional engineering structural plan check and inspection services; and authorized the City Manager to execute the contracts and to extend the agreements for up to four (4) additional one (1) year periods at the City's discretion, consistent with future budgets approved by the City Council.

5. FISCAL YEAR 2017-18 FIRST BUDGET UPDATE REPORT

City Council approved the budget adjustments and recommendations as listed in the Fiscal Year 2017-18 First Budget Update Report.

6. AN LS-1 OPTION E AGREEMENT WITH SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA EDISON FOR STREET LIGHT REPLACEMENT

City Council approved an LS-1 Option E Agreement with Southern California Edison (SCE) to replace SCE-owned street lights from High Pressure Sodium Vapour (HPSV) to Light Emitting Diode (LED) with no upfront cost to the City, and authorized the City Manager to execute the Agreement.

7. REVISIONS TO THE COMPENSATION AND BENEFITS PROFILE FOR NON-REPRESENTED PART-TIME EMPLOYEES DUE TO INCREASES IN THE STATE'S MINIMUM WAGE

City Council approved and authorized the City Manager to execute revisions to the Salary Schedule section and any non-substantive changes to update the current Compensation and Benefits Profile for employees in the non-represented Part-Time Employees Group to ensure compliance with the State of California's Labor Code regarding minimum wage changes effective January 2018; and authorized the City Manager to implement any future legally mandated changes to minimum wage rates to ensure ongoing legal compliance.

City Council authorized the City Manager to execute a sole source purchase contract with Airbus Helicopters, of Grand Prairie, Texas, in the amount of \$3,400,000 (includes sale tax) for the purchase of a new police helicopter (Model H125); and authorize the City Manager to execute a purchase agreement in the amount \$1,050,000 (includes sales tax) with CNC Technologies, of Ontario, California, for associated avionics equipment; and authorized the City Manager to execute a purchase agreement in the amount of \$1,000,000 (includes sales tax) with Hangar One Avionics, of Carlsbad, California, for the transfer and installation of the specialized avionics equipment; and authorized a \$50,000 contingency for the overall purchase and installation project.

- (B) Ontario Housing Authority Board (Authority) approved a resolution for the Second Amended Ground Lease Agreement and the First Loan Modification Agreement.

RESOLUTION NO. OHA-095 A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF THE ONTARIO HOUSING AUTHORITY OF THE CITY OF ONTARIO, CALIFORNIA, APPROVING AN AGREEMENT WITH LINC ONTARIO APARTMENTS, LP, TO SECOND AMEND THE GROUND LEASE FOR THE SEASONS SENIOR AFFORDABLE HOUSING PROJECT.

STAFF MATTERS

Council Member Bowman noted Logan's Candy as a local and long-time downtown business, and he encouraged the community to go by and watch them make holiday candy. He also noted the lights downtown are beautiful and wished everyone a Happy Thanksgiving.

Council Member Valencia expressed thanks to the Police Department and especially the Chief and Deputy Chief for the recent "Coffee with a Cop" at McDonalds. He also noted the upcoming Black Friday shopping experience and encouraged everyone to pick up a toy for the "Spark of Love" toy drive.

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Mayor Leon noted the comments by *Liz McAulis* and stressed the importance of personal safety when accessing public streets. He also thanked *Unidos por la Musica* for their efforts in giving away hundreds of turkeys for Thanksgiving.
