AGENDA REPORT SUMMARY

Staffing:

Our front desk attendant's last day was on Feb. 06th. Our Museum Assistant's last day was Feb. 18th. We will be joined by a Recreation Leader and PT temp who will help us with coverage of the front desk and assistance with education public programs. We are beginning the process to hire two additional PT Museum Assistants to fill these roles on a permanent basis.

Accreditation Update:

Our accreditation application was accepted by AAM on January 27th. We are now moving forward with the Self-Study component which must be completed by September 15th. All staff will be working together to complete this extensive process. The board should expect to see future agenda reports from

staff on various components that will need to be approved, such as our educational master, MOU with the Museum Associates and other policies that will need to be submitted with the self-study.

Education:

Our celebration of Black History month began with a tremendously successful program- our silk screen workshop had 38 participants! It was so successful that we scheduled another program for our Thursday evening hours on Feb 17th.

Built on Water:

Construction on the gallery should conclude in mid-March, at which point we can start beginning construction on the exhibit. The app (developed by Songbear) is in its final stages and should be completed by June 2022. The team is currently conceptualizing ideas for the VR experience and will be meeting with potential vendors to determine how wide of a scope is possible given our budget. We will convene a working group meeting in March to receive their feedback before we go to bid, tentatively in April.

Other Items:

New monument banners were installed on Feb. 16th that advertise our new extended hours on Thursday evenings, the Invitational, and Gem of the Foothills. Construction of our ADA accessible restroom should be completed by early March. Construction of our off-site storage facility has been delayed due to lack of HVAC equipment. Our updated timeline is for the collections move to take place in mid-May or early June.

The artists were selected by juror Kathryn Ervin, a professor in the Department of Theatre Arts at California State University, San Bernardino to participate from the 2021 Ontario Open Art Exhibition. The winning artists are Pechez Sepehri, Annie Toliver, Mary Hughes. Honorable Mentions are Rick Cummings, Patricia Jessup-Woodlin, Viktoria Romanova, Frank Carrillo, and City Council Liaison Award winners Linda Garcia-Dahle and Gus Castañeda.

Museum visitors will be able to enjoy a wide range of works in various media, including: textiles, large abstract paintings, geometric paintings with bright bold colors and assemblage. Each of the exhibiting

artists are excited to present their expertise in sculpture, recreating scenes in oil paintings, utilizing shades of watercolor, and acrylic paintings
