- 6. City Council Liaison—COVID-19 has taken a toll on the city budget, sales tax revenue is not coming in. It is looking to be a \$35 million deficit. The City is looking at ways to save money, will keep doing the best that we can do. The four-story apartments complex with retail on the bottom has been approved for construction on the C Block. A lot of City events will not be taking place this year due to COVID-19, including the Festival of the Arts.
