MOTION TO APPROVE THE MAY 22, 2023 RECREATION & PARKS COMMISSION MEETING MINUTES & THE MAY 2023 ACTIVITY & ATTENDANCE REPORT.

(BINNEY/CASKEY) WAS CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

DEPARTMENT REPORT:

3. **Recreation & Community Services** – Nicholas S. Gonzalez, Recreation & Community Services Director, narrated a PowerPoint presentation on department highlights of program activities in May 2023.

OLD BUSINESS

4. 2023 KIDS TO PARKS DAY PRESENTATION DAY – JORDAN WILSON, RECREATION & COMMUNITY SERVICES COORDINATOR, shared a report on

this annual event where children are encouraged to share their love for our city parks. On Saturday, May 20, 2023, this event was held at 5 locations throughout the city: Anthony Munoz Park, De Anza Park, Celebration Park North, Ontario Town Square, and Vineyard Park. All participants were offered various outdoor games, including parachutes, sack races, corn hole, lawn games, and face painting. Each participant received a Croc Charm and Croc Charm Bracelet. All ages and backgrounds were encouraged to attend this event.

NEW BUSINESS:

5. PROCLAMATION OF JULY 2023 AS PARKS AND RECREATION MONTH – CRISTIAN MAGANA & ASHLEY POWERS, RECREATION & COMMUNITY SERVICES COORDINATORS stated that in the Recreation & Community Services Department, our job is to connect our communities to nature, recreation, local parks and activities, and fun for all! Parks & Recreation programs protect open spaces and places for the community to gather to promote mental and physical health. Parks and Recreation Month has been acknowledged and celebrated since 1985. It was created to emphasize the importance of reflecting the community's value of parks and recreation professionals. Magana and Powers shared photos and Tik Tok videos showing a variety of programs our parks and community centers offer. This year's theme is "Where Community Grows." We will ask community members to share their favorite stories and memories of participating in our programs and parks over the years.

MOTION TO PROCLAIM JULY 2023 AS PARKS AND RECREATION MONTH (FERNANDEZ/OVITT)

(CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY)

This item will be taken at the July 18, 2023 City Council meeting for final approval by the Ontario City Council.

6. REVIEW AND APPROVAL OF THE STUDENT REPRESENTATIVE AND ALTERNATE STUDENT REPRESENTATIVE TO THE RECREATION & PARKS COMMISSION FOR 2023/2024 – CANDICE SMITH, RECREATION & COMMUNITY SERVICES MANAGER, shared the interview process by our staff panel and management team for each potential Student Representative candidate. Smith introduced Angel Huerta who currently attends Sierra Vista High School in Baldwin Park. Our management staff panel has recommended Huerta as the 2023-2024 Recreation & Parks Student Representative. Smith also introduced Isabelle Siebel, who attends Chaffey Online District High School and is recommended to be appointed as the 2023-2024 Recreation & Parks Commission Alternate Student Representative. Both candidates are residents of the City of Ontario. Each candidate presented information regarding their goals, plans, and how they feel they can best represent the youth of Ontario through their role as a Student Representative on the Recreation & Parks Commission.

MOTION TO APPROVE THE 2023-2024 STUDENT REPRESENTATIVE, ANGEL HUERTA, AND ALTERNATE STUDENT REPRESENTATIVE, ISABELLE SIEBEL, TO THE RECREATION & PARKS COMMISSION. (BINNEY/FERNANDEZ)

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

The new Student Representatives will be appointed at the July 18, 2023, City Council meeting along with the outgoing Student Representatives, who will be acknowledged and thanked by the City Council members.

7. <u>UPCOMING SPECIAL EVENTS REMINDER</u> – NICHOLAS S. GONZALEZ, RECREATION & COMMUNITY SERVICES DIRECTOR, reminded the Commissioners to reference their meeting packets that include the Community Center calendars and special event flyers, which list all upcoming events for July 2023.

COMMISSIONER & LIASION COMMENTS:

DE HARO:

Thanked Candice Smith and Ismael Medina for their support and constant guidance during her time as Student Representative. De Haro also thanked the Commission for the opportunity and said she enjoyed participating in the Commission meetings and events. She shared that she felt her opinions were valued.

FERNANDEZ:

Stated that she looks forward to working with everyone on the Commission. She congratulated the class of 2023, Tiny Tots. Fernandez stated she appreciated the department highlights report and the sharing of the promotional growth within the department staff. She said it's clear that the Recreation staff team is motivated and inspired. Fernandez stated she appreciated the hard work staff put in coordinating the parade. Fernandez asked about the process we follow as children participate in the different activities at the community centers. She asked if they were all considered "walk-ins" or do they need to "pre-register."

GONZALEZ:

Responded that all our community center activities are free to participants. Gonzalez explained the process of each new participant to the community center, must complete an emergency card for our staff to keep on file. Ages 7 and older are allowed at the center without a parent present. Gonzalez stated that each program is advertised in the Ontario Living Magazine and that all our program flyers state an age requirement.

FERNANDEZ:

Stated that she noticed many of the activities we promote state that we are an inclusive community. She shared that she wants us to ensure we also respect the parents in our community if they have concerns about their children participating in some of the center events. She stated she wants to ensure that we are inclusive to the parents, taking into consideration the different religious backgrounds and building a halfway point regarding the inclusive environment out there. She wants us to make sure we are not turning away families that do not necessarily agree with the lifestyle we are promoting.

GONZALEZ:

Stated that as part of the way we create programs and respect our Mission Statement and all of our priority values, we do take into consideration diversity and inclusion. We make sure community members of all ages have an opportunity to participate in programs that they desire. Gonzalez confirmed that all parents have the right to dictate what programs they wish their children to participate in but also the need to

create programming that is inclusive of all community members, no matter where they come from or what they believe in.

FERNANDEZ:

Shared that her concern is the age requirement. If a 7-year-old comes into the community center and the parent is unaware of what types of activities their child participates in, how can we ensure the parents are informed?

GONZALEZ:

Stated that would be a separate conversation that the parent would need to have with the staff. Gonzalez stated that we are also designated as mandated reporters as Recreation employees. Our community centers and parks are created as safe places for anyone to participate in. That is the foundation of what we believe in and ties with out values as we create safe and inclusive spaces. We respect parents' opportunity to choose what activities their children participate in. Our staff is always available for parents to converse with to identify those programs.

FERNANDEZ:

Asked if the youth, teens, or adults are requesting the programs.

GONZALEZ:

Program suggestions are requested from all age groups. We do a lot of community engagement, asking what the public wants. Gonzalez shared the successful antismoking campaign that our teens created and presented to the Commission and went on to be presented at the City Council for approval which created a nosmoking ordinance in all our city parks is one example of a community-driven policy/program.

FERNANDEZ:

Thanked Gonzalez for taking the time to answer her questions. She seeks to understand so that she can help people who don't fully understand, as we are transparent and have open discussions as the programs grow.

OVITT:

Shared that he picked up his granddaughter, who attended the city's Summer Day Camp, and how she truly enjoys attending. Ovitt also asked that we look into writing up a history of naming all Ontario city parks. It is historically important to share with the community.

CASKEY:

Thanked Nicholas Gonzalez for his department report presentation. Caskey also thanked Wilson, Magana, and Powers for their excellent presentations. Caskey welcomed the new Student Representatives, Angel Huerta and Isabelle Siebel, and new Commissioner, Adrianne Fernandez.

NELSEN:

Thanked Monique De Haro for her dedicated service as Student Representative. Nelsen thanked Nicholas Gonzalez for his reports and Debra Dorst-Porada for attending the meeting.

BINNEY:

Thanked Monique De Haro for her service as a Student Representative. Binney welcomed Adrianne Fernandez and the new incoming Student Representatives. Binney shared that he spends much time in the parks and finds it comforting as he always sees our park's maintenance staff doing their jobs. Binney stated that it helps him feel more comfortable, safe and that our parks are getting the best care.

Binney also complimented the department's use of TikTok to promote our programs.

RILEY:

Stated that she echo's everyone's comments about Monique De Haro. She shared that De Haro was the recipient of the 2023 Soroptimist's Violet Richardson's Prism award!




