

CITY MANAGER'S UPDATE

As we build momentum off the many cultural and recreational activities that we had throughout the Summer months, I want to share with the community some upcoming programs and events happening throughout Ontario.

On June 21, 2017, the City Council unanimously approved a structurally balanced budget for Fiscal Year 2017-18. The total overall budget of \$524,553,984, balanced without the use of any one-time monies, is consistent with the City Council's goals and objectives to continue to preserve public safety levels, meet community and cultural needs, and deliver on critical capital projects. One of the many budget highlights for the new year includes funding to install a new dog park in south Ontario, to be located at the Whispering Lakes Golf Course.

One of the City Council goals for next year encourages efforts to provide a healthy community. Through the City's Healthy Ontario program, our partners have been working closely with stakeholders to transform our community centers into hubs for health activities and wellness. Our mission is to better connect our residents to healthy living resources focused on four main areas: Prevention & Wellness; Access to Healthcare; Education & Lifelong Learning; and Safe & Complete Neighborhoods. 

GENERAL REGISTRATION POLICIES

No phone-in registration accepted. Please provide proof of residency. Students must pre-register online, via mail or in person. First time registrations must show proof of residency (i.e. Current Driver's License or utility bill). No registration fees will be accepted at class locations or by instructors. Refunds will only be issued for cancelled classes, and take approximately 3 weeks to process. Transfers and Credits will only be issued prior to the 2nd class meeting.

Don't let your favorite class get canceled due to lack of enrollment. Please register a minimum of 48 hours before the class start date.

SPECIAL NEEDS REQUEST

Individuals with disabilities are welcome to participate in City of Ontario's classes, programs, and activities. The City asks for notification of accommodation to be given at IE. ten (10) days in advance of the class, program, or activity start date; however, less notice may be appropriate in some circumstances. 

Aviation is more than airplanes. It's technology, aircraft, productions and testing facilities, air terminals, and other components that support civil, military and commercial flying. Aviation in Ontario tells the story of American life and industry in the twentieth century, from early recreational pursuits and experiments with flying, to mammoth cargo and personal carriers supporting World War II and military missions, to the changes brought to the advent of advanced jet aircraft. As the airport developed over time, its primary functions, uses, and users changed responding to trends and global affairs giving the history of aviation in Ontario a rich and diverse story to tell.

Plane enthusiast and recreational flyers Archie Mitchell and Waldo Waterman are credited as founders of what would later become the Ontario International Airport (ONT) in 1923. Development of a full service airport at its current location began in 1929. In 1942, the U.S. Army Air Corps, who later became the U.S. Air Force, acquired much of the airport property for wartime use. Soon after in 1949, California Air National Guard used the south portion of the airport property as a training station until 1966.

Aircraft support services provided by Lockheed and General Electric Aircraft Engines established at ONT in 1946. Lockheed would remain in operation at ONT until 1998. International cargo and freight operations began once the U.S. Army Air Corps vacated in 1946. Commercial passenger travel resumed at ONT in the 1950s with the construction of the first terminal and control tower. Shortly thereafter in 1960, the first terminal was replaced by Terminal One. In 1998, two new terminals were constructed east of the Terminal One building.
