CITY MANAGER'S UPDATE

As we close out the summer season and enter into the autumn months, I am pleased to highlight some news and information of developments and events occurring throughout Ontario.

This past spring, the Ontario City Council held a grand opening ceremony for the new Schimmel Dog Park at John Galvin Park. The new dog park, located at the northeast corner of Cucamonga Avenue and I Street, is dedicated in memory of "Ex" Von Der Schimmel-Schultz-Heide, the first Police Department Service Dog who gave his life in the line of duty on July 2, 1986. Be sure to take your dog and visit this new park and the amenities it has to offer.

On June 15, 2016, the City Council unanimously approved a structurally balanced budget for Fiscal Year 2016-17. The total overall budget of \$469,372,820, balanced without the use of any one-time monies, is consistent with the Mayor and City Council's goals and objectives to continue to preserve public safety levels, meet community and cultural needs, and deliver on critical capital projects. We will also be adding 21 new Police Officer positions, bringing the total to 33 additional positions in the last 24 months.

The primary City Council goal for Fiscal Year 2016-17 remains: Regain local control of the Ontario International Airport. I am happy to report that the Ontario City Council and the Ontario International Airport Authority (OIAA) continues to work in bringing your Ontario International Airport (ONT) back to local control. On June 21, 2016, the House of Representatives approved, H.R. 4369 which helps facilitate the transfer of ONT from the City of Los Angeles to the OIAA. On July 13, 2016, the Senate approved the final passage of Federal legislation facilitating the transfer of ONT to the Ontario International Airport Authority. As of this writing, the bill has been sent to President Obama to be signed into law. To stay updated with the latest information regarding the transfer of ONT, visit www.OntarioOIAA.com.

The 2016 Route 66 Cruisin' Reunion is right around the corner. This annual three day event will come to the historic downtown area on September 16-18. Be sure to mark your calendars to attend this free event showcasing hundreds of classic cars, live music, food and vendors, and entertainment for the entire family! The downtown area is thriving with many arts and cultural amenities for the community through various programming and events. myONTARIO

SMART PHONE APPLICATION

The City of Ontario has unveiled the "myOntario" iPhone and Android Phone application that allows residents with smart phones to point, click and send photos of maintenance issues such as:

- Graffiti
- Potholes
- Roadside debris
- Shopping cart
- Storm drains
- Street sweeping
- Lane stripina
- Traffic signs, sidewalk, curb, gutter maintenance
- Tree trimming
- Park maintenance
- Weed abatement
- Sprinkler problems

iPhone and Android users may download the "myOntario" application for free from the iPhone App Store and Android Market by searching for the keyword "myOntario". Once installed, users will simply open the application and follow the prompts to take a picture of the issue and then tap "submit". Using built-in global positioning system technology, "myOntario" will attach a location to the picture and route the information about the problem to the appropriate City department for resolution. City staff and Vendors will now be able to respond like a business, using better technology, encouraging efficiency and taster response times.

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In continuing celebration of the City of Ontario's 125th anniversary since the incorporation, we are reminded of the town's founder, George Chaffey. Chaffey was of Scottish heritage born in Canada in 1848 and left school at the early age of 13. At 14, he became an apprentice marine engineer in his father's shipbuilding yard on Lake Ontario, Canada. By the time he reached 32, he was a well-established ship designer. That same year he visited his father in California and, by 1886, he and his brother William had established the irrigation

colonies of Etiwanda, Ontario and Upland. This ultimately led to the founding of the Ontario "Model Colony." On Saturday, October 8, 2016, Ontario Heritage will portray George Chaffey at their 7th Annual Historic Cemetery Tour held at the historic Bellevue Memorial Park in Ontario.
